
Reading and Writing

This term, we will be continuing to read *Letters from the Lighthouse* by Emma Carroll but also introducing the classic wordless graphic novel *The Arrival* by Shaun Tan. Children will begin to understand what it means to leave your family and start a new life in a new country.

The children are already excited to find out more about the man and his family:

- * Why is he leaving?
- * Where is he going?
- * What creature do the mysterious tentacles belong to?
- * What challenges will he face when he arrives?

In Year 6, the students also get introduced to a new picture book and chapter book every week, which they are encouraged to borrow and read independently.



Other Areas of the Curriculum

In **Science**, students will be learning about **Evolution and Inheritance**. Students will be taught to identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways, and that adaptation may lead to evolution. Pupils will recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago.

In **DT**, the students will be learning sewing and embroidery techniques.

Our **Humanities** focus will be both **History** and **Geography** as we continue learning about World War 2.

Year 6 have **PE** on **Mondays and Thursdays.** Please ensure students wear PE kit and trainers on this day and the correct school uniform on every other day. Hooded jumpers should ONLY be worn on PE days.
